

Background


- 2018 General Use Permit (GUP) childcare issues raised
- Concerns about costs and availability
- 2020 Board Direction: Conduct a focused Childcare Study to inform Community Plan update.

<u>Purpose</u>

• Assessment of childcare services offered by Stanford University to faculty, staff and graduate students.

Graduate Student Population

Approximate Total (2021-22): 9,300



Childcare Study Approach

To learn more about childcare among Stanford faculty, staff, post-doc scholars, and graduate students:

- Conducted by Public Consulting Group with assistance of Graduate Student Council and other student organizations
- Focus groups among the population to learn more about individual experiences
- Evaluation of current Stanford childcare programs compared to national standards and four peer institutions
- Data on cost of living and childcare costs for the San Jose-Santa Clara metro area


Annual Childcare Costs

As a percentage of estimated annual pre-tax cost of living 2 working adults, 1 child household





Number of full-time students, faculty, and staff per child served




Hours of Childcare Consumed

Frequency Childcare Needs Were Met


How often were the childcare needs met for all your children during the last 12 months?



Annual Childcare Costs


As a percentage of annual household income



- All peer institutions **manage waiting lists** for on-campus care

- All peer institutions offer students, faculty, and post docs **assistance with paying for off campus childcare options while on the waiting list.**

- Wait time data impacted by multiple factors

Financial Aid:

Peer institutions offer **comparable childcare assistance** options for on and off campus care

Recommendations


1. Finalize Quality Ratings For All On-Campus Childcare Centers
