




What is the Stanford University Community Plan?

- 4,017 acres of Stanford lands


Academic Growth Boundary (AGB)



Background

1985 Land Use Policy Agreement

"Stanford intends to continue to provide all municipal services to its academic facilities in the unincorporated area of Santa Clara County."

2000 Stanford Community Plan Policy

SCP-GD 9: The provision of urban services to the academic lands of Stanford University shall be the responsibility of the University. This may be accomplished through direct provision of such services by Stanford, payment of in-lieu fees, or appropriate contractual relationships with local jurisdictions.



Methodology

- Compare services to those provided by the City of Palo Alto
- Compare services to other large private university in California (University of Southern California – USC)



Key Findings

- Services are generally equivalent to those provided by cities
- Transparency of service delivery needs improvement
- Fiscal transparency and public accountability is limited
- A framework to document services is needed
- Where warranted, collaborate on a voluntary funding mechanism
